RING 1 - PONY & HORSE SHOWJUMPING

PRIZE MONEY IN SHOW JUMPING CLASSES 4 - 13. MUST BE COLLECTED ON THE DAY. 1st - £6,

2nd - £4, 3rd - £2. Adjusted according to the number of entries.

Sash for the Competitor gaining the most points in this ring at each show. Presented after the last class.

CLEAR ROUND JUMPING - entries at the ring side-£5. Last entry 9.45 a.m. 9.00 am - 10.00 am

- 1. LEAD REIN JUMPING 30cm Riders 10 years and under. See notes 1 & 4.
- 2. JUMPING 30cm Junior Riders only. See notes 1 & 4. Sponsored by Blackthorn Farm Livery, Mobberley
- 3. JUMPING 40cm Junior Riders only. See notes 1 & 4. Sponsored by Blackthorn Farm Livery, Mobberley
- 4. JUMPING 50cm Intro. Pony not to ex. 148cm. See notes 2 & 4. No Fillers.
- 5. JUMPING 50cm Intro. Horse to ex. 148cm. See notes 2 & 4. No Fillers.
- 6. JUMPING 60cm Pre-novice. Pony not to ex. 148cm. See notes 2 & 4.
- 7. JUMPING 60cm Pre-novice. Horse to ex. 148cm. See notes 2 & 4.

CLEAR ROUND JUMPING - entries at the ring side - £5. For one hour only.

- 11. JUMPING 75cm Intermediate. Horse to ex. 148cm. See notes 3 & 4.
- 12. JUMPING 80cm Small Open. Pony not to ex. 148cm. See notes 3 & 4.
- 13. JUMPING 80cm Small Open. Horse to ex. 148cm. See notes 3 & 4.
- 13a.JUMPING 85cm Juniors/Seniors jump together. One set of rosettes/prize money. Seniors only qualify for STARS. May be split if sufficient entries. See notes 3 & 4. +
- 13b.JUMPING 1m Juniors/Seniors jump together. One set of rosettes/prize money. Juniors will qualify for 90cm at STARS, Seniors will qualify for 1m. May be split if sufficient entries. See note 3 & 4. ★

PLEASE NOTE

Class 1 – Junior riders must stay on the lead rein for all other classes entered and remain on the lead rein at all times. With the exception of class 42 FIRST RIDDEN EQUITATION. See note 5 page 15. One to three riders may be amalgamated. One set of rosettes. One set of prize money. Points will be allocated Ponies/Horses. Please check with Show Secretary on the day.

NOTES

- 1. Classes 1-3 Junior riders only. One round timed. There will only be a 'jump off' in the case of equality for first place, (same faults, if any, and time). The times will be used to determine the minor placings.
- 2. Classes 4-7 Show Jumping. Ponies and Horses will jump their first round together. Riders eligible for the 'Jump Off' will them be split Ponies/Horses. Two sets of rosettes, prize money and points. Please state which section i.e Class on entry form.
- 3. Classes 8-13 Single Phase Show Jumping. Competitors will complete both sections unless eliminated. Second section will be against the clock and fences will be higher. The winner will be the competitor with the least faults in the fastest time. Split Ponies/Horses. Two sets of rosettes, prize money and points. Please state which section i.e Class on entry form.
- 4. The Mr. Quickstep trophy will be awarded to the junior riding a horse which attains the most points in this ring. Members only. Sponsored by Katie Meredith.

RING 2 - IN HAND

Hard Hats conforming to current standards, fastened, must be worn by all Junior Handlers (17 years & under). This rule is also recommended for Senior Handlers

- YEARLING, 2 & 3 YEAR OLD IN HAND colt, filly or gelding, any height at maturity. See notes 1 & 2. ★
- 15. BEST TURNED OUT IN HAND Juniors and Seniors.
- 16. COLOURED, SPOTTED, PALOMINO, DUN OR ROAN HORSE/PONY IN HAND. See note 3. If unsure please ask Show Secretary if your horse/pony qualifies. ¥
- 17. COB IN HAND Mare or Gelding. May be shown hogged or traditional state. See Note 3.
- MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND MIXED HEIGHT IN HAND all breeds. May be split if sufficient entries. See note 3. ★
- 19. HORSE/PONY IN HAND May be split Horses/Ponies if sufficient entries.
- 20. VETERAN HORSE/PONY IN HAND -15yrs and over. See Note 4. ★
- 21. TOTS HANDLER Handler 4-8 years on 1st January in the current year.
- 22. YOUNG HANDLER Handler 9-12 years on 1st January in the current year.
- 23. HANDLER Handler 13 years and over on the 1st January in the current year. \star
- 24. BONNY PONY IN HAND not to ex. 14.2hh.
- 25. PONY THE JUDGE WOULD MOST LIKE TO TAKE HOME IN HAND
- 26. PONY WITH THE NICEST TAIL- IN HAND
- 27. PONY WITH THE CHEEKIEST FACE IN HAND

In classes 14 to 20 and classes 21 to 27, the 1st and 2nd placings will compete for the In Hand Champions of the Day. To be held after classes 21 and 27. Members will receive points, to be accrued throughout the season.

NOTES

- All stallions and colts must be bitted and handled by an adult competitor (18 years & over on 1st January in the current year). Stallions must also wear a bridle tag. Please see WRC Rule 5, Page 33.
- 2. Class 14 May be split if there are sufficient entries. In this case, yearlings will be judged separately.
- 3. Classes 16, 17 & 18 to be shown in accordance with breed society rules.
- 4. Class 20 May be split according to age: 15-20 years and 21 years and over, if sufficient entries. Please state age on entry form.
- 5. All classes in this ring are open to non-members.
- 6. Classes in this ring qualify for separate overall trophies.

- 28. GREEN HORSE / PONY age 6 years and under. See Note 1.
- 29. RIDDEN SHOWING to include Show Ponies/Horses may be split if sufficient entries. Open to any breed/type. See note 2.★
- 30. NOVICE RIDDEN SHOWING may be split if sufficient entries. Open to any breed/type. See note 2. Not to have won an open ridden showing class before 1st January in the current year.
- 31. RIDDEN HORSE OR PONY OF COB TYPE may be split Horse/Ponies if sufficient entries. May be shown hogged or traditional state. ¥
- 32. RIDDEN COLOURED, SPOTTED, PALOMINO, DUN OR ROAN. Juniors may be led. See note 6. If unsure please ask Show Secretary if your horse/pony qualifies.★
- 32a. RACEHORSE TO RIDING HORSE to be ridden by either a Junior or Senior. Horse to have been registered as a racehorse and trained but not necessarily to have raced. Must be registered with ROR. ★
- 33. LEAD REIN PONY Rider 8 years and under. May be shown plaited or natural state. See notes 3 and 6. ★
- 34. LEAD REIN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND PONY Rider 8 years and under. See notes 3 and 6.★
- 35. FIRST RIDDEN PONY to include Mountain & Moorland Rider 12 years and under. To be shown plaited or natural state. May be split if sufficient entries. See note 3.★
- 36. PONY OF HUNTER TYPE to include Show Hunter ponies not ex.153cm, rider any age. See note 4. ★
- 37. RIDDEN HUNTER to include Show Hunters ex.153cm ★
- VETERAN HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN 15 yrs and over. Junior riders may be led. See Notes 5 & 6. ★
- 39. RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND, SMALL BREEDS & LARGE BREEDS. Small breeds NO SPURS. May be split if insufficient entries. See note 6. ★

In all classes, the 1st and 2nd placings will ride off for the Ridden Showing Champion of the day. Members will receive points, to be accrued throughout the season.

NOTES

- 1. Class 28 horse/pony not to have won a ridden showing class before 1st January in the current year. To be ridden in a snaffle bridle with cavesson, drop or flash noseband.
- 2. Class 29 & 30 All breeds/type of ponies/horses to be shown together.
- 3. Classes 33, 34, 35 To be judged on manners and suitability as a child's pony. This is not a Show Pony Class. To be ridden in a snaffle bridle with cavesson, drop or flash noseband. No spurs.
- 4. Class 36 May be split not ex.133cm and ex 133cm 153cm if sufficient entries.
- 5. Class 38 Rosette for best Over 21 year old. May be split according to age: 15 to 20 years and 21 years and over, if sufficient entries. Please state age on entry form.
- 6. Classes 32,33, 34 & 38 Junior riders on the lead rein must stay on the lead rein for all other classes entered and remain on the lead rein at all times, with the exception of Class 42, FIRST RIDDEN EQUITATION. See note 5 page 15.

- 40. BEST TURNED OUT Juniors and Seniors. (Juniors may be led). See notes 4 & 5.★
- 41. LEADING REIN EQUITATION riders 8 yrs and under. See notes 1, 3, 4 & 5.
- TOTS RIDDEN EQUITATION riders 10 yrs and under. Will not be asked to canter. See notes 1, 3 & 5. RULES. SEE NOTE 5.
- 43. FIRST RIDDEN EQUITATION riders 10yrs and under. Will be asked to canter. May not be on the lead rein. See notes 1 & 3.★
- 44. GREEN RIDER EQUITATION Juniors & Seniors. Will not be asked to canter together. See notes 1, 2 & 3.
- 45. JUNIOR NOVICE EQUITATION riders 17 and under. See notes 1, 2 & 3. 🛨
- 46. JUNIOR OPEN EQUITATION riders 17 years and under. See note 3. ★
- 47. SENIOR NOVICE or OPEN EQUITATION riders 18 years and over. May be split Novice and Open if sufficient entries. See note 3.★
- 48. RIDING CLUB HORSE/PONY Riders any age. To be judged primarily on manners for Riding Club activities. May include one small fence at the judge's discretion. See note 6. ★

At the 14th June Show, the Charlotte Measures Trophy to be awarded to the highest placed member in Class 46, Junior Open Equitation. To be presented at the WRC Presentation evening.

In classes 41-47, the 1st and 2nd placings will ride off for the Equitation Champion of the day. Members will receive points to be accrued throughout the season.

NOTES

- 1. Classes 41, 42, 43, 44 & 45 to be ridden in snaffle bridle with cavesson, drop or flash noseband, 41, 42, 43 & 44 no spurs.
- 2. Classes 44 & 45 rider not to have won an equitation class before 1st January in the current year.
- 3. Age qualifying date for rider 1st January in the current year.
- 4. Class 40 & 41 Junior riders on the lead rein must stay on the lead rein for all other classes entered and remain on the lead rein at all times, with the exception of Class 42.
- 5. Class 42 ONLY MAY ENTER OTHER CLASSES ON THE LEAD REIN. THIS RULE IS TO ENCOURAGE YOUNG RIDERS TO COME OFF THE LEAD REIN TO COMPETE. ROSETTES ON THE DAY BUT NO POINTS IF ENTERED IN OTHER CLASSES ON THE LEAD REIN. IF ENTERED IN OTHER CLASSES ON THE LEAD REIN, MAY NOT ENTER CHAMPIONSHIP.
- 6. Class 48 may be split into horses and ponies, if sufficient entries. Please state section on entry form.

PRIZE MONEY IN ALL WORKING HUNTER CLASSES (must be collected on the day). Class Starts 10.00 am

- 49. INTRO WORKING HUNTER 35cm 40cm. Horse/Pony any height, rider any age. (Juniors may be led). May enter Pre-Novice Working Hunter only. (*Kead rein only*) NOT Novice or Open Working Hunter Classes.
- 50. PRE-NOVICE WORKING HUNTER 50cm. Horse/Pony any height, rider any age. May not enter Open Working Hunter Classes. See note 1 & 2.
- 51. MOUNTAIN and MOORLAND WORKING HUNTER 60cm 65cm Horse/pony any height, rider any age. To be shown in natural state. NO SPURS. May be split if sufficient entries. See note 2.
- 52. NOVICE WORKING HUNTER 60cm 65cm. Horse/Pony any height, rider any age. See notes 1 & 2.
- 53. WORKING HUNTER STYLE & PERFORMANCE 70cm. Horse/Pony any height, rider any age. To be judged on Jumping only. No Show section. See note 2.
- 54. WORKING HUNTER HORSE/PONY including MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND 75cm. May be split, not ex. 143cm & ex 143cm if sufficient entries. See note 2. May be shown plaited or natural state.
- 55. SMALL (fences) OPEN WORKING HUNTER 85cm 90 cm. Horse/Pony any height, rider any age. See note 2.
- 56. LARGE (fences) OPEN WORKING HUNTER 95 cm. Horse/Pony any height, rider any age. See note 2. 🔶

'MR LUCKY' CHAMPIONSHIP after Class 56. See Note 2.

NOTES

- 1. Definition of "Novice" class 52. If BOTH the rider and the horse have won a first rosette before the 1st January in the current year, for Working Hunter, not necessarily as a combination, they will not be eligible. If only one or the other has won, they will be eligible. Winners may continue to enter as Novice for the remainder of the season and points will be accrued for the annual trophy.
- 2. In all Working Hunter classes the first and second placings will ride off at the end of the day for the Champion and Reserve Working Hunter of the Day who will receive points, to be accrued throughout the season, for the Mr Lucky trophy. A Championship League Table will be kept separately.
- 3. Hors Concours entries will be allowed in Working Hunter classes but this debars competitive entries in further Working Hunter classes.
- 4. Competitors may enter Novice and Open if eligible.
- 5. Prize money will be given in all Working Hunter classes. 1st £6, 2nd £4, 3rd £2, adjusted according to number of entries.


There are qualifying classes for STARS, members only, and Trailblazers, open to members & non-members. Please see the noticeboard for further details.
