Ring 1 – Ridden Showing Classes (Approx. 9.00am start)

Class 1: Lead Rein – 133cm & under.

Class 2: Novice Ridden Showing – any height, open to combinations who have had no more than 3 showing wins.

Class 3: Riding Club/Pony Club Horse or Pony. Judged on suitability for a variety of Riding Club and Pony Club activities.

Class 4: Show Horse or Pony (including Hacks). Open to any height show- or hack-type pony or horse.

Class 5: Riding Horse or Hunter. Judged according to type. Will be split if entries permit.

Class 6: Veteran Horse or Pony – 15 years or over. Veteran Horse Society and VHPRC qualifier.

Class 7: Mature Rider – For riders 35 years and over. Will not be required to jump. VHPRC qualifier.

Class 8: Ridden Cob (Traditional or Non-Traditional). May be presented in Traditional, or Non-Traditional turnout. Will be split if entries permit.

Class 9: Coloured Horse or Pony (including Spotted, Appaloosa, Palomino and Roan) . May be presented in Traditional, or Non-Traditional turnout. Will be split if entries permit.

Class 10: M & M (Large and Small Breeds). Large breeds: Highlands, Fells, Dales, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh Section C & D. Small breeds: Exmoors, Dartmoors, Shetlands, Welsh Section A & B. Class will be split if numbers permit

Class 11: Ridden Foreign Breeds (including Part-Breds): Open to any foreign breeds including Warmbloods and British-bred Foreign Breeds.

Class 12: Thoroughbred – Open to Wetherby's registered horses bred to race, whether they have raced or not. ROR registered horses will be eligible for ROR League Points.

Best in Show Ridden (Champions and Reserve Champion) – For all horses / ponies who have won a ridden class 1-12.

Ring 2 – In-Hand Showing Classes (Approx. 9.00am start)

Class 13. 3 Years & Under Young Stock - Open to fillies, colts and geldings aged 3yrs & under.

Class 14. Young Handler 12yrs & Under - Open to any horse or pony with handler 12yrs or under.

Class 15. Mature handler - Open to any horse or pony with handler 35yrs or over. VHPRC qualifier.

Class 16. In-hand Show Horse or Pony (Includes Hacks) - Open to any Show Horse, Hack or Pony of any height. Will be split if entries permit.

Class 17. Best Conditioned Horse & Pony -Open to any horse and pony of any height.

Class 18. Riding Horse and Show Hunter Horse/Pony – Open to horses and ponies. Judged according to type. Will be split if entries permit.

Class 19. In-hand Cob - Open to cob horses and ponies.

Class 20. M&M (Small and Large Breeds) - Small Breeds: Exmoors, Shetlands, Dartmoors, Welsh Section A & B. Large Breeds: Connemara, Dales, Highland, Fells, New Forest, Welsh Section C & D. Part breeds not permitted. If numbers permit, the class will be split.

Class 21. Veteran Horse & Pony 15yrs or Over - Open to any horse and pony 15yrs or over. Trailblazers, Veteran Horse Society and VHRPC qualifier.

Class 22. Traditional and Non-Traditional Coloured (including Spotted, Appaloosa, Palomino, Dun and Roan) - Traditional coloured horses and ponies must have feather and full mane and tail. Non-Traditional are to be plaited or hogged with no feather. If numbers permit, the class will be split. If not, the horse or pony will be judged to type.

Class 23. Best Foreign Breed (including part-breds) - Open to any type of part- or pure-bred foreign breed of horse and ponies, including Warmbloods and British-bred Foreign Breeds.

Please note that classes may be combined for placings, however this will not affect qualification opportunities.

Best in Show (Champions and Reserve Champion) – For all horses / ponies who have won an in-hand class today class 13-23.

Ring 1: Concours D'Elegance (CES Affiliated)

Approx. 1pm Start

Class 24: Open In Hand – costume or traditional attire.

Class 25: Ridden Novice/Nervous/First Timers – perfect class to give concours a go. Costume and traditional attire.

Class 26: Open Ridden Costume – for costume only.

Class 27: Open Ridden Coloureds – includes cremello, dun, appaloosa, et cetra. Costume or traditional attire.

Class 28: Best Ridden Veteran – for horses or ponies aged 15 years and over. Costume or Traditional attire.

Class 29: Ridden Mountain and Moorland – including part-bred. Costume or Traditional attire.

Best in Show Ridden (Champions and Reserve Champion) – For all horses / ponies who have won a ridden class 24-29.

Please see guidance notes below regarding all Concours D'Elegance classes.

Ring 3: Working Hunter (Approx. 1pm Start)

Class 30: Nursery Stakes – Ponies, 133cm & under, Rider age 12 & under.	Max 50cm

Class 32: Working Hunter 148cms & under	Max 60cm	
Class 33: Working Hunter Exceeding 148cms	Max 70cm

Trailblazers Championships 2021

Competitors placed 1st to 4th in any of our showing classes (with the exception of Concours D'Elegance, Child Handler, Mature Handler and Mature Rider classes) will be eligible to receive a qualification invitation letter (ask for one at the Secretary's office). Once qualified, it is up to the competitor if they take up the invitation. If they wish to enter the Championships, the competitor must purchase a qualification card to enter the Championships. Once qualified, competitors are able to enter any Showing or Working Hunter class they are eligible for at the Championships. Currently, the championship dates and venue are yet to be published.

Concours d'Elegance – CES UK Guidelines

1st and 2nd placings in each CES Affiliated class qualify for the CES UK Championship.

All Concours d'Elegance classes will be run according to the CES UK Guidelines as follows:

When you and your horse step into the ring, you are under the eye of the judge(s). The overall first impression of the horse and rider upon entering (turn out of horse, costume, tack, et cetra) is crucial – sit up proud, take a step back in time and ride into the ring as though you are parading your best dress around the estate!

The fit of the costume – Skirts should not be too long or drooping/slipping, this can cause an accident should the horse step on the skirt, and will result in a lower placing.

A good rule of thumb for skirt length is "below the dock and not the hock". Jackets should equally fit well, not too tight making the rider look uncomfortable. Information on how to weight a skirt can be found on the CES UK Facebook page.

CES UK judges love to see colour coordination. A hat band to match your costume will do you a big favour in the ring, and making sure your hair is neat and tidy is a good addition too. This does not mean your hair must be in a bun.

Top hats do not automatically result in a higher placing. Please Note if your hat is not a ridding hat within the BSS, a disclaimer must be signed when placing your entry.

Any movement in the skirt will result in a lower placing, all riders whose skirt remain in place will be up the line.

End decision is purely the judge's personal choice, costume colour, design, horse, etc.

Judges must (when handing out rosettes) explain the placings.

Stallions are required to wear a stallion disk. Stallion riders/handlers must be 14 years and over. Equally, other competitors are requested not to overcrowd a stallion. In-hand – stallions and colts must be bitted. In all cases, the stallion or colt must remain under control.

Any horse found to be causing disruption to a class will be asked to leave.

1. The judge's decision is final

2. No entries will be accepted without the appropriate fee

3. Correctly fitted footwear and headgear that conform to the current safety standard must be worn at all times when mounted.

4. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times

5. In the event of cancellation, your entry fee will be carried over to the next Tumpy Green event. No Refunds given.

6. A vets or doctors' certificate will be required if a withdrawal is made and request for a refund given due to the incapacity of horse or rider

7. No jewellery to be worn and long hair to be secured above collar height.
