Entries

Online entries can be made before the day using a secure online entry system from the Kimpton Horse Show website www.kimptonhorseshow.co.uk.

Postal and online entries can be made up until 9pm on Saturday 24th July. All entries after this time will incur a charge of £2 on top of the cost of the class entry fee and will be classed as an 'on the day' entry.

We now accept card payments at the show for entries and trophy deposits.

Prizes and awards

All cups and trophies awarded are perpetual challenge trophies and therefore must be returned within 1 year. A deposit of £30 will be required for each cup taken from the showground. An administration fee of £5 will be charged if the cups are not returned by June 30th for the coming year's show. We reserve the right to issue replica trophies.

The Harding Perpetual Challenge Trophy

This Trophy will be awarded to the combination of horse and rider who accumulates the greatest number of points throughout the Show. Points will be awarded in all classes except Gymkhana, Fancy Dress, Personality Pony and Clear Round Jumping, as follows:

1st. Place - 12 Points	2nd. Place - 8 Points
3rd. Place - 4 Points	4th. Place - 2 Points

The Wren Perpetual Challenge Trophy sponsored by Martin Wilkinson Master Saddlers

This trophy will be awarded to the combination of horse and rider who accumulate the second greatest number of points throughout the Show. Points will be awarded in all classes except gymkhana, fancy dress, personality pony and clear round jumping, as above.

The Showing Register

TSR NAF FIVE STAR Showing Finals – This show is a qualifier for the 2021 TSR NAF FIVE STAR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals!

TSR NAF FIVE STAR Riders Finals – 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification flyer in the ring.

TSR NAF FIVE STAR In Hand Finals – The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand Flyer will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their flyers signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website. Full details at <https://www.theshowingregister.co.uk/>

TSR Medal Awards – TSR members can collect qualification flyers & signatures and redeem for a TSR Medal see TSR website for details.

First, second and third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in eligible classes will qualify for the Championship Show to be held at Arena UK on Sunday 5th September 2021. If a competitor has already qualified, it may be handed down to 6th place at judge's discretion. Each competitor qualified should become registered with EQCDS within 21 days of the qualifying show. This show is a qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championships held at The All England Jumping Course, Hickstead from Thursday 16th – Sunday 19th September 2021. The Championships are for unaffiliated and amateur competitors in Dressage from Intro to Elementary, Show Jumping from Lead Rein to 1.05m; Showing for lead rein, in-hand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more, Eventers Challenge from 60cm through to 1m.

Qualification: 1st – 4th in dressage, show jumping & showing and 1st-6th in eventers challenges.

AREA QUALIFIER

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

Young Rider Championship qualification. A Young Rider rosette and qualification will be awarded to the young rider of the Judge's choice, entitling them to enter the Young Rider Championship at the National Veteran Open Championships. This award is given at the Judge's discretion.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Open Championships, 1st - 3rd October 2021 at Arena UK. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule.

Horse/ponies 4 years and over. Jumps raised at each round, clears in each round go through to the next round. Starting height 70cm

Horses/ponies 4 years and over. Competition run against the clock with points accumulated for fences successfully cleared. To include a 'joker' fence worth double points, or minus points if a fault is incurred.

Horse 4 years and over. Jumps approx. 80cm

CLASS 16. CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

To be judged on the overall picture of elegance presented by horse/pony and rider including appearance, conformation, and individual show. Horses and ponies 4 years and over, rider any age.

CLASS 17. RETRAINED RACEHORSE

Horses to be aged 4 years and over, measuring 15hh and over. Open to Thoroughbreds who have retired from racing and are now retrained. Horse must have raced and be able to show a race record. To be judged on conformation, manners and way of going. Blemishes are not considered. Horses must be registered with Weatherbys General Stud Book or overseas equivalent.

Pony to not exceed 153cm (15hh), rider under 25 years on 1/1/21.

Horse exceeding 153cm. (15hh), rider any age.

Class 49. STAGG FAMILY GYMKHANA

£2.50 per race or £12 for all 6 races. Tickets sold ringside on the day. One ticket to be presented at the ringside per race. Riders will be divided into groups depending on age:

Group A	Riders 5 years & under. Ponies to be on a leading rein
Group B	Riders 6 - 8 years inclusive.
Group C	Riders 9 - 12 years inclusive.
Group D	Riders 13 - 16 years inclusive

Championship rosette presented to the horse/rider combination accumulating the greatest number of points in each group.

CONSOLATION RACE

For all competitors who haven't yet won a rosette, rosettes for all entrants.

Terms & Conditions

Cantering or galloping on the showground, except in the rings or in the immediate vicinity of the practice ring, is strictly prohibited. Anyone violating this rule is liable to be disqualified from all classes with no refund on entry fees.

Unfortunately we are unable to accommodate colts or stallions on the showground.

No lunging of horses or ponies on the showground or in practice rings.

Proof of age may be required in appropriate classes where age limits apply, prize money may be withheld until this is produced.

Age as on the day of the show unless otherwise stated.

For safety reasons hard hats to at least current BS standard must be worn at all times when mounted or driving exercise vehicles on the showground and a jacket must be worn when jumping. Body protectors are also recommended.

In the event of classes clashing or running late, entry fees WILL NOT be refunded; competitors must choose which class they want to compete in. Refund of entry fees will only be made on production of a doctors or vets certificate. Entrants arriving late will not be admitted into a class unless at the judge's discretion.

Any objection to any award must be lodged in writing at the secretary's caravan, on the showground, within thirty minutes of the end of the judging of the class in question. The objector must pay a deposit of £10 to the secretary when the objection is lodged.

Neither the committee, nor any judge or steward or other official shall be liable for injury to the person, the horse or any other personal property of any competitor, spectator, or other person, however arising. It is an express condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the committee, judges, stewards and other officials harmless in respect of all such injury or damage.

Authorised officials and competitors ONLY are allowed in the ring. The decision of the judges and committee is final.
