Smart appearance in the ring at all times

The organisers reserve the right to alter or cancel any classes and to refuse entry on to the showground

The Judges decision is final

Whips must not exceed 30 inches in length

The correct standard of hat must be worn with a chin strap at all times when mounted unless the competitor signs a disclaimer at the secretary office.

Horse or ponies under the age of 4 years old must not be ridden on the showground

Dogs are welcome but must be kept on a lead

No mucking out of horseboxes on the showground

Please take your rubbish home with you or use the bins provided

Stallions and colts welcome but must be handled by a competent person

Refunds are only given if we cancel a class, we do not give refunds if a competitor withdraws from a class

In Hand Classes – Starts 9.30

Ring 1

Class 1 Youngstock – 1, 2, 3 years old

Class 2 Best Condition – may split between horses and ponies if sufficient entries

Class 3 Mountain and Moorland – may split between large and small breeds if sufficient entries

Class 4 Best Mare – may be split between horses and ponies if sufficient entries

Class 5 Bonny Pony

Class 6 Best Handler – may split between seniors and juniors if sufficient entries

Class 7 Condition Regardless of Flaws – Judged purely on confirmation and going regardless of any scars or blemishes

Ring 2

Class 8 Veteran – 15 years and over

Class 9 Shetland – full or miniature

Class 10 Best Cob/Heavy Type – can be shown natural, plaited or hogged

Class 11 Best Gelding – may be split between horses and ponies if sufficient entries

Class 12 Best coloured – piebald, skewbald, roan, dun, cremello, palomino, spotted

Class 13 Partbred – may be shown natural, plaited or hogged

Class 14 Novice – combination not to have won 3 1st places in previous season

AFTERNOON PERFORMANCE – for all 1st and 2nds

Future In Hand Star for all competitors awarded a gold rosette (eligible for supreme)

Ring 1 championship – for all 1st and 2nds in ring 1

Ring 2 championship – for all 1sts and 2nds in ring 2

In Hand Supreme Champion – for all reserve and champions from future star, ring 1 championship and ring 2 championship

There will be a 30 minute break for the judge prior to the ridden classes commencing. Ridden classes will not commence before 1pm

Ridden Classes – All ridden will be in the full 65m x 35m indoor arena

Class 15 First Ridden inc Lead Rein – judged separate - lead rein must be attached to the nose band, child 12 years and under, to be ridden in a snaffle.

Class 16 Promising Newcomer – open to horses and ponies that are 4, 5 and 6 years old

Class 17 Absolute Beginners – open to horse/pony, rider any age, inc lead rein. No group canter and canter optional in individual show

Class 18 Novice Ridden – open to horses/ponies. Combination not to have won 1st in previous season. No group canter

Class 19 Ridden Pony Class

Class 20 Ideal Partners – judged on manners, performance and compatability

Class 21 Mountain and Moorland – may be split between large and small

Class 22 Ridden Gelding

Class 23 Ridden Mare

Class 24 Open Ridden Hunter

Class 25 Ridden Cob/ Heavy Type

Class 26 Ridden Coloured – piebald, skewbald, roan, dun, cremello, palomino, spotted

Class 27 Ridden Veteran – horse/pony 15 years and over

Class 28 Best Ridden Part Bred

Class 29 Riding Horse

FUTURE STAR CHAMPIONSHIPS

8 Star awards will be allocated to the judge at the start of the in hand and ridden classes. The judge will present the stars to the combinations who show the most potential for the future, and will not necessarily be the class winner. All holders of Gold stars will be eligible for the relevant Future Star Championship regardless of the placings in your class.
