RING 1 -Novice Ridden & In-Hand Showing 10.30 AM

Judge: Mrs Helen Francis (Classes 1 to 4), TBC (classes 5-8)

Class 1 BEST HORSE OR PONY IN -HAND- open to all types and breeds

Class 2 BEST YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND (foal to 4 years)

Class 3 NOVICE RIDDEN HORSE OR PONY – combination of horse and rider not to have been placed first in any showing class. Lead reins permitted. Cantering only permitted in individual shows.

Class 4 RIDDEN VETERANS - 15yrs and over; (Age to be displayed on bridle.)

Class 5 RIDING CLUB HORSE OR PONY - (class may be split at 14.2hh, includes 1 or 2 small jumps)

Class 6 BEGINNER WORKING HUNTER OR WORKING HUNTER PONY (40-50cm)

Class 7 NOVICE WORKING HUNTER OR WORKING HUNTER PONY (60-70cm)

Class 8 FAMILY HORSE OR PONY (To be suitable for and preferably ridden by 2 generations, may include lead rein for junior family member)

RING 2 – Ridden, Side Saddle and Fun Showing 10.00AM

Class 9 RIDDEN HORSE (over 14.2hh eg Hunter, Hack, Cob, Riding horse, TB, coloured, any show type-judged on type, manners and way of going appropriate for type)

Class 10 RIDDEN PONY (14.2hh and under, , judged on type, manners and way of going appropriate for type. **Rosette to ALL junior riders**).

Class 11 SIDE SADDLE EQUITATION (OPEN) - affiliated to SSA- QUAL

Class 12 SIDE SADDLE CLASSICAL LADIES - affiliated to SSA- QUAL

Class 12 A CONTEMPORARY LADIES SIDE SADDLE- affiliated to SSA- QUAL

Class 13 SIDE SADDLE RIDING CLUB HORSE OR PONY - affiliated to SSA Fun Classes

Class 14 BEST THELWELL

COMPETITORS MUST WEAR A HAT TO CURRENT BRC SAFETY STANDARD OR ABOVE EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Members' Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Side Saddles sponsor a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette sponsored in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member and Just So Elegant Side Saddle Hire sponsor a rosette for the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.

SIDE SADDLE RIDING CLUB HORSE/PONYCLASS

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: Riders will be required to give a short show including a small jump, maximum 61cm (2*). The height may be adjusted during the course of the class at the Judge's discretion. The class shall be judged on the show, the manners of horse/pony and its suitability for the rider. Conformation will not be considered. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards.

CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE OUALIFIER

Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners and & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider.. Judges may request a short show, but exhibits; but horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted.. Judges must use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, the Qualification Card may be passed down to fourth place. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. One special rosette and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying combination at each show, this may not always be the winner. If the winner has already qualified they may be passed down to fourth place. Qualifiers kindly sponsored by Mrs. T. Mitchell and Mr. L. Mitchell. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. The four highest placed **Riding** Horse, Hack (not ex 160cm), Cob or Hunter, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualify for the current year's BSHA Championship Show Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5 th place. Combinations qualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship Show may carry forward the qualification, to the following year. SSA Members who qualify for The Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA in order to compete in any Side Saddle class at the BSHA National Championship Show. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the Championship.

SIDE SADDLE CONTEMPORARY LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER

Open to SSA Adult and Junior Members and Non-members riding a Native, Part Bred, Heavy or World Breed horse/pony side saddle. To be judged 25% suitability of horse/pony for rider, 25% manners and way of going for type, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider. Conformation will not be taken into consideration. The Judge will request a short show. Traditional habits must be worn. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. One special rosette and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying combination at each show, this may not always be the winner; if the winner has already qualified they may be passed down to fourth place. Qualifiers kindly sponsored by *The Langley Family* Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only

SIDE SADDLE COSTUME CONCOURS d'ÉLÉGANCE

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. Competitors should produce a brief résumé about their costumes for the Commentator.

Qualifier also for the JVJ Championship 2024 (tbc).

TRRC RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- All events will be run in accordance with the current British Riding Clubs Rule Book, and specific class rules as stated in the schedule, where appropriate.
- 2 A copy of the BRC Rule Book will be available on the day at the Secretary's office.
- 3 The Judge's decision shall be final.
- 4 All objections shall be lodged in writing within 15 minutes of the alleged incident. A deposit of £10 required, which will be refunded if the objection is sustained.
- 5 Neither the organisers nor the Deadman Estate, accept liability for any claims in respect of injury or damage to any person, animal or property, however caused.
- 6 The organisers reserve the right to change Judges or appoint substitutes and to amend the schedule as necessary.
- 7 The organisers reserve the right to reject or cancel any entry made by any person or to cancel or combine any class they see fit, (refunding any fees paid less £2 per competitor to cover administrative expenses).
- 8 All entry fees must accompany entry forms. No entries will be refunded without a Vet or Doctor's Certificate.
- 9 Children **must** be kept under control and supervised at all times.
- 10 Dogs must be kept on leads at all times.
 - Hats to be worn (and correctly fastened) to current BRC standards in ALL ridden classes or when mounted-including side saddle eg VG1 01.040 (2014-12, both with BSI KITEMARK). Hats may be checked.
- 12 All competitors must wear the correct riding clothes whilst competing and exercising at competitions. Back protectors must be worn when XC jumps are included.
- 13 Misuse of whips or spurs will incur elimination. Blatant use of bad language or aggressive behaviour from a competitor or spectator will result in them being asked to leave immediately. They may also be banned from future TRRC events.
- 14 Car Park Steward and Competition Stewards' instructions must be followed at all times
- 15 Entry fees (less £2 per competitor to cover administration costs) will be refunded if the event is cancelled.
- 16 All horses and ponies must be at least four years old.
- 17 Horses must be kept to a walk unless in the warm-up or competition arenas.
- 18 The organisers reserve the right to eliminate any competitor who, in their opinion, places him/herself or others in any danger or who fails to observe the rules. All competitors must act in a safe and responsible manner at all times.
