This show is a qualifier for the South West Pony Association Championships to be held on 28th to 30st August 2025 at The David Broome Event Centre, Crick, Monmouthshire. NP26 5XP

To qualify for the Championships:

SWPA Members Enter one of the qualifying classes in rings 1 & 2. Be either first or second in the class, and get your card signed. Take a picture of the card and upload via www.showingscene.com

Non SWPA Members Enter one of the qualifying classes. Register on-line at www.showingscene.com **within 14 days of qualification**. Send an Email to RichardatSWPA@aol.com advising of the show you attended, the class entered, and the position gained. You will be sent Qualifying Cards for the Horses / Ponies registered.

Please Note: Registration fee for 2025 is £25 to include all members of the family and equines owned by the family.

This show is affiliated with The Concours d'Elegance Society of GB to be held 26th & 27th September 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Rugby, Warwickshire, CV23 8AJ.

Horses and ponies, placing first, second and third in eligible classes, who have not yet qualified, will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes. Qualified horses/ponies will receive a qualification card in the ring, allowing the owner to enter the Championship Show. Owners and riders/handlers must be, or become, registered with The Concours d'Elegance Society within 21 days of the qualifying show. No horse registration is required. Ring 1 – IN-HAND SHOWING

All classes may be split if entries warrant

Start 9am – Judge: Mr K & Mrs T Rees

09:00 Class 1 Best Youngstock 1/2/3 year old – Filly, Colt or Gelding, any height. ONLY 2 Highest placed owner bred qualifies for SWPA Championship, please wear white armband if eligible.

09:30 Class 2 Hunter – Any age, to exceed 148cm at maturity.

10:00 Class 3 X Racehorse/ROR – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. 4 years and older. The equine **MUST** have raced either on flat, over jumps or point-to-point. To be judged on the sustainability to compete in all disciplines.

10:30 Class 4 Coloured Horse/Pony – Any age, any height. To include Piebald, Skewbald, Appaloosa, Spotted, Palomino & Dun. Class may split – 14'2 and under. 14'3 and over.

11:00 Class 5 Young Handlers – Mare or Gelding. NO COLTS OR STALLIONS. Handlers to have attained their 4th birthday before 1st January in the current year but not to have attained their 18th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

11:30 Class 6 Pure, Anglo & Part Bred Arab – Any age. Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Horses to be registered with respective breed society.

Ring 2 – IN-HAND SHOWING

All classes may be split if entries warrant

Start 9 am – Judge TBC

09:00 Class 7 Veteran Horse/Pony – Any height. Horse or Pony to be 15 years or over. Age to be displayed on bridle.

09:30 Class 8 Traditional/Native Cob – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Any height.

10:00 Class 9 Show/Maxi Cob – Horses to be over 148cm.

10:30 Class 10 Open Show Pony – Mare or Gelding. Not exceeding 148cms.

11:00 Class 11 Mountain & Moorland including Part bred Mountain & Moorland – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Handlers any age. Ponies must be registered with their respective Pure Breed Society Stud Book. – Stallion, Mare or Gelding – all animals **MUST** be registered. Any age. – **Top 2 from each category will qualify.** – May be split Small and Large Breeds depending on entries.

11:30 Class 12 Competition Horse/Pony – Any height, any age. Class may be split not exceeding 148cm and exceeding 148cm

Championship: 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1 to 12 to qualify for In-hand Championship.

Ring 1 – RIDDEN SHOWING

All classes may be split if entries warrant. All ridden horses & ponies must be 4 years & over.

Start - not before 12:30 – Judge: Mr K & Mrs T Rees

12:30 Class 13 Veteran Horse/Pony – Any height. Horse or Pony to be 15 years or over. Ages to be displayed on bridle.

13:00 Class 14 Traditional/Native Cob – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Any height. Riders any age. Horses/ponies four years and over.

13:30 Class 15 Show/Maxi Cob - Horses to be over 148cm. Horses four years and over

14:00 Class 16 Ridden Hunter – Exceeding 148cm. Riders 16 yrs & over on 1st Jan.

14:30 Class 17 X Racehorse/ROR – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Four years and over. The Equine **MUST** have raced either on the flat, over jumps or point-to-point. TO be judged on the sustainability to compete in all disciplines.

15:00 Class 18 Pure, Anglo & Part Bred Arab - Four and over. Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Horses to be registered with respective breed society.

Ring 2 – RIDDEN SHOWING

All classes may be split if entries warrant. All ridden horses & ponies must be 4 years & over.

Start – not before 12:30 Judge: TBC

12:30 Class 19 Coloured Horse/Pony – Any height. To include Piebald, Skewbald, Appaloosa, Spotted, Palomino & Dun. Class may be split 14'2 under and 14'3 and over.

13:00 Class 20 Junior Ridden Open – Mare or Gelding. Riders **MUST** be within the correct age limits for the type of Horse/Pony ridden for qualification to be valid.

13:30 Class 21 Competition Horse/Pony – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Any height. Judged 60% Performance to include Freestyle show and 40% conformation.

14:00 Class 22 Mountain & Moorland including Part bred Mountain & Moorland – Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Riders any age. Ponies must be registered with their respective Pure Breed Society Stud Book. – Stallion, Mare or Gelding – all animals **MUST** be registered. Four years and over. – **Top 2 from each category will qualify.** – May be split Small and Large Breeds depending on entries

14:30 Class 23 Lead Rein Pony – Mare or Gelding. Not to exceed 122cm. Riders not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1st January in current year.

15:00 Class 24 Ridden Show Pony. Mare or Gelding. Four years old and over. Not exceeding 148cms.

(Riders to be suitable size for pony ridden)

Championship: 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 13 to 24 to qualify for Ridden Championship.

Ring 2 – CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE - to follow Ridden Championship not before 15:45

Affiliated with The Concours d'Elegance Society of GB @ Onley Equestrian Centre, 26th & 27th September 2025.
Places 1st-3rd.

Judge: Miss E Morrell

Class 25 – In hand Concours d'Elegance – Walk and a short trot from front to back of the group.

Class 26 – Ridden Concours d'Elegance – Walk and trot in the 'go around' on both reins. Canter may be shown in individual show.

Class 27 – Homemade Costume

Championship: 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 25 to 27 to qualify for Concours d'Elegance Championship.

Rules & Conditions of Entry

1. This event will run under current riding club rules
2. The committee reserve the right to refuse entry or disqualify any animal that is deemed unfit to compete
3. The committee & land owners will not be responsible for any injuries arising from accidents to persons or animals, or theft of properties on the ground during the event.
4. The judges decision is final, the committee reserves the right to alter or vary the schedule or to decline entry.
5. Hard Hats are always compulsory when mounted & for safety should comply with current standards.
6. All horses & ponies must be at least 4 years old & over to compete in ridden classes.
7. STALLIONS – any pony stallions not exceeding 138cm may NOT be ridden by anyone under the age of 12, stallions exceeding 138cm may NOT be ridden by anyone under the age of 14.
8. All foals being shown must be a minimum of 3 weeks old on the day of the show & mares with foals at foot must have obtained their fourth birthday.
9. All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. Failure to do so will result in you being asked to leave the showground. All dogs foul must be picked up.
10. STRICTLY WALK ONLY in car park or to the ring as you will be asked to leave the showground with no refunds.
11. Strictly no parking of horseboxes/trailers in non-designated car park.
12. **Objections must be handed to the Secretary IN WRITING within 15 minutes of the end of the class, together with a deposit of £10. Objections will be dealt with at the end of the day. In the event of a complaint, a height certificate may be required to be produced.**
13. In the event of cancellation, entry fees will be refunded. This runs alongside the conditions if the entire show is cancelled.
14. Refunds will only be issued on production of a vet's/doctor's certificate.

HEALTH & SAFETY

1. The committee has taken every reasonable precaution to ensure the health, safety & welfare of those attending the show. Members of the public & competitors are equally responsible for ensuring they do not put others at risk & that they cooperate with the organisers in compliance with Health & Safety Legislation.
2. In the interest of safety please ensure that Horses, Trailers, Lorries & all tack are left secure when unattended.
3. The onus is on every rider who suffers a fall or anyone who suffers an injury whilst in the showground to report the fall/injury to the show secretary and be checked over by the First Aid officer.
4. Traders associated with & the permission of FFRC & CCR ONLY to be welcome on the show ground.
